Brazil is the largest country on the continent.




Brasilia is the capital city of Brazil.

Rural Brazil: Kayapo People




The Kayapo People are an indigenous group who live in the Eastern part of the Amazon Rainforest in Brazil. They live sustainably, working in harmony with the rainforest.
