



This week's learning.

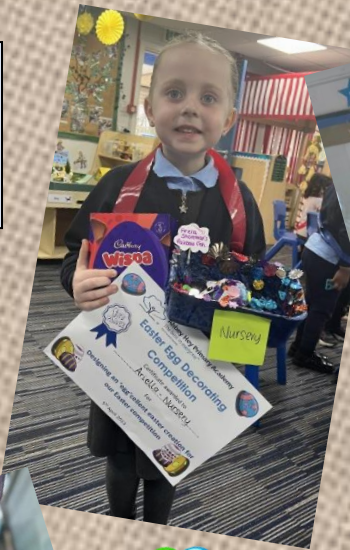
- Nursery have been talking about their favourite things, answering questions using full sentences and responding to the question 'why?'

During my time here at Abbey Hey Primary Academy:

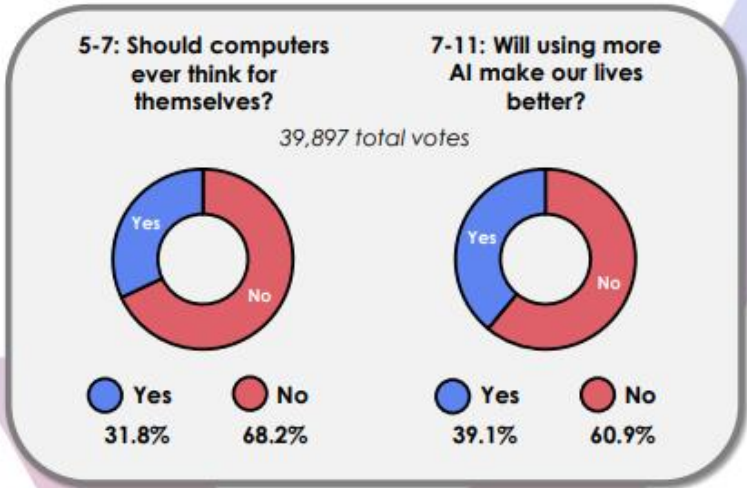
1. I will demonstrate the academy's values of determination, ambition, enthusiasm, creativity, confidence, and respect in all that I do.
