
Knowledge Organiser

History

History is the study of <u>people</u> who lived in the <u>past</u>.

Historians study history. They put events in order, and learn about how life has changed.



Sources

Sources give us information about the <u>past</u>. They can be lots of things, including videos, artefacts, images and memories.

Vocabulary

- artefact: things that humans have made and then left behind
- **before**: happening earlier in time than something else
- <u>communication</u>: the way we tell someone something. It can be through lots of different ways: talking, writing, or even frowning or smiling!
- **family tree**: a picture that shows the relationships between your family members
- <u>generation</u>: all the people from the same or different families who were born around the same time
- grandparent: a parent of your parent!
- **<u>great-grandparent</u>**: You can describe them in two ways: a parent of your grandparent, and a grandparent of your parent
- <u>historian</u>: a person who studies history. They do a range of jobs, including teaching, writing books, or working in television or museums
- <u>historical source</u>: something that tells us about the past; where we get out information about the past from
- <u>history</u>: the study of people in the past
- parent: the one or two adults at home who look after you*
- **past**: the time before now; (adjective) describing something that has happened
- **present**: now; (adjective) describing something that is happening now
- <u>source</u>: where something comes from
- <u>sibling</u>: brothers and sisters, including half-brothers, half-sisters, stepsisters and step-brothers
- <u>video</u>: moving pictures
