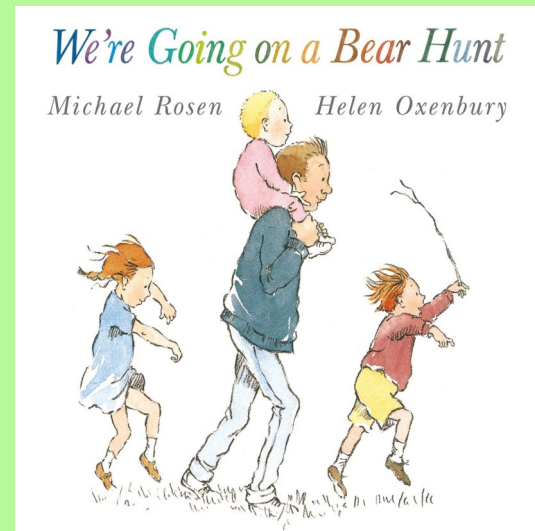
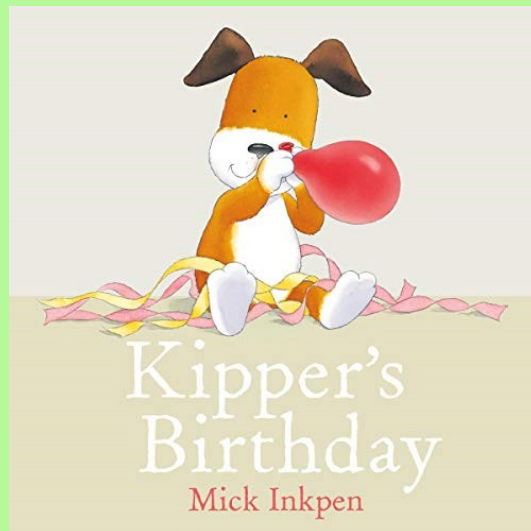

Bears and Special Days



What are we learning about?

This half-term the children will be exploring two new topics called 'Bears' and 'Special Days'.

During our 'Bears' topic the children will be reading the stories 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' and 'Where's My Teddy!'. The children will examine the bears in their stories, as well as different real-life bears such as pandas, polar bears, brown bears and black bears. We will even be making our very own bear cave!

In our 'Special Days' topic the children will be exploring a range of celebrations such as birthdays, Christmas, Diwali and Eid. Our role-play area will be turned into Santa's Workshop, where the children can wrap, weigh and sort presents. We will even plan a real birthday party for Kipper by writing invitations, making him a birthday card, baking a cake and enjoying some party games!

Communication, Language and Literacy

During our phonics sessions this half term the children will be exploring banks of vocabulary. Topics include farm animals, the home, zoo animals, colours, people who help us and parts of the body. We will provide opportunities for the children to use this new vocabulary across our adult-directed sessions.

During Literacy this half term the children will enjoy listening to longer stories, develop their communication skills by sharing ideas with peers/adults, engage in extended conversations and begin to write some of the letters in their name.

Understanding the World

This half term the children will use their 5 senses in a hands on exploration of natural materials, such as the smell, texture and appearance of festive items. They will use their observation skills to discuss the differences between materials and changes they notice, for example freezing items, predicting the quickest way to retrieve them from the ice and checking if they were right. The children will also continue to develop positive attitudes about the similarities/differences between people by exploring a range of celebrations such as Eid, Christmas and Diwali.

Learning Outdoors

This half term we will be spending time in our outside areas by going on a bear hunt, building bear caves and making delicious birthday cakes in our mud kitchen!

The children will continue to enjoy their weekly forest school sessions in which we share stories outside, enjoy a drink and snack around our campfire and use natural resources to build dens.

Learning in Maths

During our maths sessions this half-term the children will explore 2D shapes (circles, rectangles, triangles and squares), recite numbers to and beyond 5, identify/create patterns and make comparisons between objects in relation to height, length and weight.

The children will have the opportunity to demonstrate their understanding in our Santa's Workshop role-play area by comparing the size/weight of presents, creating their own patterned wrapping paper and using their number knowledge to count the presents they have wrapped.

Physical Development

The children will take part in team games which promote skills such as skipping, hopping on one leg, throwing, catching and navigating around a space with confidence. The children do not need to bring in a PE kit, however they can wear trainers on PE day.
