Learning in Early Years

Welcome back to Nursery!, We hope you have enjoyed the Holiday!

This information is designed to help you learn with your child and follow the same themes we are studying in class.

We are going to be spending our time enjoying the Summer sunshine, building sandcastles, splashing in the water and visiting the Ice cream farm.

How many pebbles on a beach?

We will be exploring the seaside and looking at the different creatures that live in and around the ocean. The children will be able to learn about pirates and enjoy searching for the pirates hidden treasure. Sand and water will be available for the children to play in every day so it is important that they bring with them to Nursery a change of clothing.

Learning in Literacy

Speaking and Listening

We will be listening to the sounds of the seaside such as the ocean, seagulls and waves crashing on the shore.

Reading

We will be sharing stories that help us to explore the seaside such as "Look what I found at the seaside" by Paul Humpries. We will also be singing seaside songs and rhymes as well as learning poems that describe life by the sea.

Writing

Emergent writing will be a very important part of your child's early writing development. We encourage and praise all marks made on paper and in notebooks to help children value their own work even at this early stage. We will continue to focus on the children writing their names using the correct letter formation.

Working together, parents as partners.

Your child needs to bring their book bag into school every day so we can return paintings and letters from school to you. Please check this every night. You may wish to share exciting moments and achievements with Nursery via the bag as well. You can write a note, share a picture or a photograph. We love to see what the children enjoy doing at home.



Learning Outdoors

We will be spending lots of time exploring the outdoors and investigating the changes taking place. Our outdoor environment will become a beach with a giant sand pit, deck chairs and even flying seagulls. The children will be able to experience life by the seaside and enjoy our very own beach party.

Learning in Maths

Number

We will continue to practice counting to twenty and will look at more than/less than, What is one more/less than five?

Shape, space and measure

We will be measuring Ingredients for our beach party food and looking at how we measure liquids. Looking at different containers we will begin to estimate which one will hold the most/least water.

Investigation Area

We will have a selection of Natural objects such as sea shells, drift wood, seaweed and seaside plants for the children to investigate, using magnifying glasses to get a close up look at the different shapes and patterns.

Being Imaginative with Music / Drama

We will explore and re create the sounds of the sea, enjoy singing seaside songs and maybe even a pirate shanty or two. We will be making home made shakers to recreate the sounds of crashing waves and stormy seas.
