Learning in Year 1

Learning in English

Speaking and Listening

Children will continue to work collaboratively with talk partners to help extended their understanding and vocabulary. We will also be incorporating drama in to our Literacy lessons and reading our work allowed to our partners.

Reading

This term we will be focusing on a number of texts based on the theme 'Superheroes' which include; 'Supertato' and 'Traction Man'. We will also be using non–fiction texts to support our learning in History and Geography as well as sharing a variety of books in whole class reading sessions.

Children will also continue to develop their knowledge of phonics in our daily sessions.

Writing

In writing this term, the children will continue to develop their writing skills, specifically focusing on spelling, punctuation and grammar. To support this learning, it would be great if you could practice with your children the common exception words at the back of the curriculum map.

Children will demonstrates their writing skills in a range of genres including non chronological reports and narratives. Their will be based around our topic 'Superheroes'. To further develop their writing skills we will have a revised focus on editing and improving their own work, in particular reading their work aloud. We will also have a continued focus on handwriting, forming letter in the

Learning in Maths

This term children will focus on four key areas: Time, money, word problems and measurement.

Time:

We will be exploring analogue clocks and telling time to the hour and half hour. Children will also learn to estimate durations of time and compare measures of time.

Money:

Children will learn to recognise coins and notes through their different shapes, sizes, materials and markings.

Word problems:

This term children will be learning how to solve one-step addition and subtraction word problems. Children will be able to show and explain their working out.

Measurement:

Children will explore different ways to measure and the different units of measurement in terms of

Learning across the wider Curriculum

Geography: In Geography children will learn where they live. They will be able to explain their address including their road name and town.
History: We will explore different old and new objects including toys and artefacts. They will look and discuss how objects and toys have changed over time. Children will also compare their life as a baby to their life now. They will create a timeline of key events of their lives and discuss what and how things have changed. In addition we will be looking at historical real life 'superheroes' such as Rosa Parks who made important contributions to society.
Art/DT: In our Art lessons we will be learning about the work of pop artist Roy Liechtenstein. Children will create their own pop art comic book words in his style.
RE: We will be exploring Christianity and Islam. We will look at how and why people celebrate special and sacred times.

PE: Team work and cooperation will be the focus of our PE sessions this half term. **Computing:** This half term, children will continue their work on algorithms. They will be using algorithms to control the movement bee-bots and also looking at algorithms that aren't quite right,
