## What is JASS?

Junior Award Scheme for Schools, or JASS, is an inclusive, easy-to-access award scheme.

It provides a holistic framework for a wide range of learning experiences to encourage, capture and recognize achievement.

JASS is a certificate-based award, progressing over eight levels with an increased time commitment at each coloured level. Each level is structured into four sections which are designed to stretch different aspects of developing confident individuals.

At Abbey Hey, as part of our Education with Character agenda, we provide a wide range of activities to enable each pupil in KS2 to achieve their JASS certificate and develop life-long skills and interests beyond the National Curriculum.



There are four sections to stimulate and capture a range of activity from individuals, each requiring a set amount of hours spent on them:

My interests – a new hobby, interest of skill, or an existing one which can be developed further.

Get Active, Stay Active – regular involvement in a sport or physical activity.

Me and My World – a community or nature-based project.

Adventure – involvement in outdoor activity.
