Judaism and Hinduism


This term our RE focus is on what Jews and Hindus believe about their gods. We will look at how both religions started and the key beliefs surrounding their gods. We will then compare the similarities and differences between these beliefs.

Key facts	Key Vocabulary
 What do Jews believe about their gods? Jews believe that there is only one God. They believe they have a special agreement with God called a covenant. Jews promise to obey God's laws to say thank you to him for looking after them. What do Hindus believe about their gods? Hindus believe in a universal soul or God called Brahman. Brahman takes on many forms that some Hindus worship as gods or goddesses in their own right. Hindus believe that there is a part of Brahman in everyone and this is called the Atman. The three great Hindu gods are called the Trimurti. They are called VIshnu, Brahma and Shiva. 	God/Goddess: A god is a male god and a goddess is a female god. Avatar: a manifestation of a god in a person on earth. Trimurti: three aspects of the universal supreme god. Brahman: Universal soul or God. Covenant: an agreement Judaism: The religion followed by Jews. Hinduism: The religion followed by Hindus.
