This term our RE focus is on why Jesus is seen as inspirational by some people. We will be exploring key aspects of Jesus' life and teachings. In addition to this, students will consider the impact that believing in Jesus will have on a believer's life and reflect on the importance of Jesus for Christians today by considering the celebrations at the festival of Holy Week and Easter.

Key facts

- Christianity is the world's biggest religion, with about 2.2 billion followers worldwide. It is based on the teachings of Jesus Christ who lived in the Holy Land 2,000 years ago.
- Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He came to earth to teach about love and fellowship.
- Jesus was a Jew who was born about 2000 years ago in Bethlehem. Jesus lived for 33 years before being crucified by the Romans.
- Christians are people who believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, and who follow his teachings.
- Christians believe that Jesus rose from the dead and appeared to his disciples (followers) to show everyone that there is another life with one, eternal, loving God.
- The Bible is the Christian holy book. It is divided into the Old and New Testaments.
- The cross is the main symbol. It reminds Christians that Jesus died on the cross to save them.

Christian:	A person who has received Christian baptism or is a believer in Christianity.
Jesus:	Jesus or Jesus Christ is the name of the man who Christians believe was the son of God.

Symbol:	A symbol is something that represents or stands for something else.
Parables:	A simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson, as told by Jesus in the Gospels.
Samaritan:	A charitable or helpful person.
Miracle:	A miracle is a wonderful and surprising event that is believed to be caused by God.
Lent	Lent is a Christian festival marking the 40 days and nights before Easter.
