What does it mean to belong to a faith community?

This half term, our focus is to answer the question 'What does it mean to belong to a faith community?'

The term 'faith community' refers to a group of people (of any size) that live near each other and follow the same religious traditions.

Key facts

- We live in a community that belongs to many different religions.
- We belong to many different groups in our lives, these could be faith based or not.
- There are certain rites of passage that each faith group should undertake during their lives.
- A Bar Mitzvah takes place when a boy is 13 years old while a Bat Mitzvah takes place when a girl is 12 years old.
