





CULTURAL CAPITAL:

At Abbey Hey Primary Academy, we work hard to ensure that we provide our children with a curriculum that is ambitious and designed to provide the knowledge and cultural capital they need to succeed in life, beyond primary school. This curriculum extends beyond the academic and enables children to develop and discover their interests and talents. We endeavour to support our children to develop their character – their resilience, confidence and independence – and help them know how to keep physically and mentally healthy. We want to equip children to be responsible, respectful, active citizens who contribute positively to society; to develop their understanding and appreciation of diversity; and to celebrate differences and things we have in common.

We consider character as having three distinct aspects:

Being full of character: a person described as 'a character' or 'full of character' has interests, is interested and curious, knows who they are, what matters to them and what they stand for. They will have done enough, tried enough and experienced enough to have found their passions and interests, and will be able to express themselves confidently.

Having character: someone 'has character' or 'shows character' when they dig deep, show grit, resilience and resourcefulness and do their best even when it looks like they won't succeed. They help others do the same, lead, encourage and bring out the best in others.

Being of good character: To say that someone 'has good character' is to say that they have a strength or integrity, which may prevail over self-interest, social pressure or attractive but poor choices. A person of good character 'does the right thing even when no-one is looking'.



Primary Pupil Charter:

Each year all pupils will:

- **Be encouraged to take part in at least one co-curricular club, attending for the duration of the club**
- **Go on a school trip**
- **Perform music or drama to an audience**
- **Represent their class in individual and team activities**
- **Share their views on the school through student leadership structures**
- **Hear from an inspirational speaker or author**

In Key Stage 1, all pupils will:

- **Have a named role with classroom responsibilities**
- **Volunteer time to serve the local community**
- **Go on a school trip to place of local significance**

In Key Stage 2, all pupils will:

- **Represent the school in a sporting, cultural or academic event**
- **Learn a musical instrument**
- **Have the opportunity to stay away from home and bond with classmates**
- **Watch a professional performance live at an inspiring venue or in school**
- **Deliver a presentation to an audience**
- **Volunteer time to serve the local community**
- **Demonstrate leadership outside of their class or taking on specific named pupil leadership roles**
- **Experience a workplace environment**
- **Reflect on their aspirations and personal development goals with an adult in the school**
