


On the Move

What are we learning about?

This half-term the children will be exploring a new topic called 'On the Move'.

Throughout this topic, we will learn about different modes of transport, such as trains, planes, cars and boats.

We will also have visitors in school discussing and sharing their modes of transports with us, such as firefighters and motor bikes.

Communication, Language and Literacy

During our communication and language sessions we will

- Know many rhymes, be able to talk about familiar books, and be able to tell a long story.
- Use talk to organise themselves and their play.
- Use longer sentences of four to six words.

In Literacy children will

- Develop their phonological awareness so that they can spot and suggest rhymes and experience and appreciate rhythm.
- Understand the five key concepts about print:
- Print can have different purposes
- Use some of their print and letter knowledge in early writing.

Understanding the World

- Explore and talk about different forces they can feel
- Show interest in different occupations
- Explore how things work

Learning in Maths

This half term we will

Counting

- Say one number for each item in order 1,2,3,4,5
- Know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total

Linking numerals and amounts

- Showing the right number of objects to match the numeral to 4
- Experiment with their own symbols and marks as well as numerals.

Position and Direction

- Describe a familiar route
- Discuss routes and locations, using words like 'in front of' and 'behind'

Pattern

Extend and create ABAB patterns – car, train, car, trains

Shape

Talk about and explore 3D shapes

Physical Development

This half term we will

- Continue to develop their movements, balancing, riding (scooters, bikes and trikes) and ball skills
