- •Secondary source (noun): A historical source that was not created by someone who experienced the time firsthand. It was created about a primary source, so it is a second-hand source of information.
- •Cloisters (noun): A rectangular, open space covered by walks. They are found in monasteries, churches and old collages.
- •Past (noun): Gone by.
- Present (noun): Existing or occurring now.

Gorton Monastery through the ages

Gorton Monastery was built in 1872, as many people moved to the town to work for the railways. The monastery was run by Belgium friars. The Monastery was used for services and to help the community.



The Monastery closed in 1989 as the Engineering Works closed, and people moved out of the area. The Monastery became a derelict ruin



In 2005, lottery funding and local volunteers helped to repair the monastery. It is now used for weddings and concerts.
