

On the Farm

### What are we learning about?

This half-term the children will be exploring a new topic called 'On the Farm'.

The children will begin by being introduced to the animals who live on a farm. We will investigate where the food we eat is grown by taste testing fresh produce, such as vegetables, fruit and dairy. Most excitingly, we will be spending time with our chickens! The children will help us to finish their coop by planting herbs for them to peck and building enrichment activities for them. We can't wait to watch them enjoy their home, they might even lay an egg or two!

## Communication, Language and Literacy

During our phonics sessions this half term the children will be learning their set I sounds. At Abbey Hey we follow the Read Write Inc program when teaching phonics and early reading. The children have enjoyed their sessions so far and will begin to form some letters independently.

During Literacy this half term the children will be reading a range of books that will support them to draw and label their own animal pictures correctly, name baby animals, make predictions about a text, create their own story maps and identify rhyming words.

#### Understanding the World

This half term the children will continue to enjoy their weekly investigations to support curiosity, questioning, and the development of early scientific skills. We will become farmers and plant our own seeds, observing the changes as they grow. The children will study the lifecycles of both different plants in our forest school area and our new animals by creating life cycle charts.

#### Learning Outdoors

This half term we will observe the changes to our natural environment as spring arrives! We will:

- Build enrichment activities for our Nursery chickens.
- Go on a Spring welly walk to discover the arrival of new plant life and animals.
- Create our own farmyard using the large construction blocks.
- Plant a range of produce such as potatoes, garlic and tomatoes.

The children will also continue to enjoy their weekly forest school sessions in which we share stories outside, enjoy a drink and snack around our campfire and use natural resources to build dens.

#### Learning in Maths

During our maths sessions this half term we will sort farm animals according to size, use 3D shapes to create farm buildings, count out baby animals using 1:1 correspondence and use positional language to find hidden hens.

#### Physical Development

The children will develop their gross motor skills in our outdoor area by balancing, running, jumping, hopping and climbing.

They will practice playing team games, such as tag, races and football.
