Visit Manchester City Centre



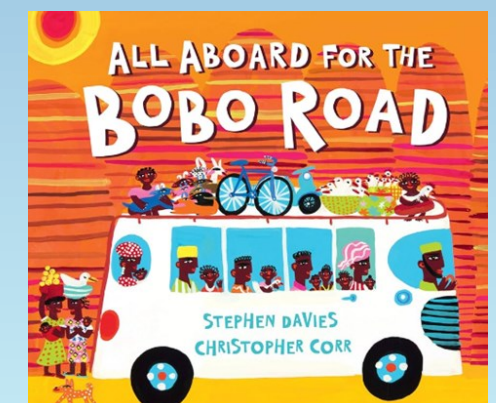
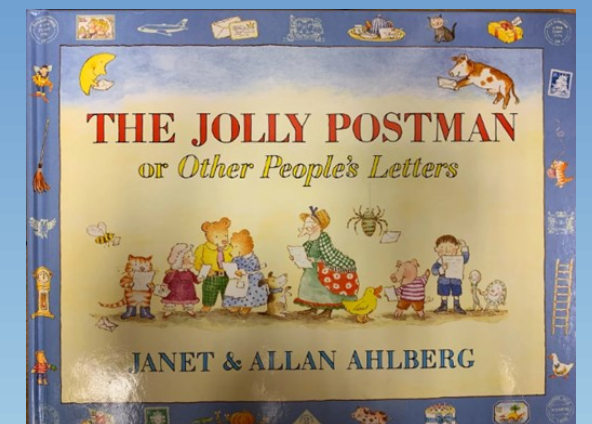
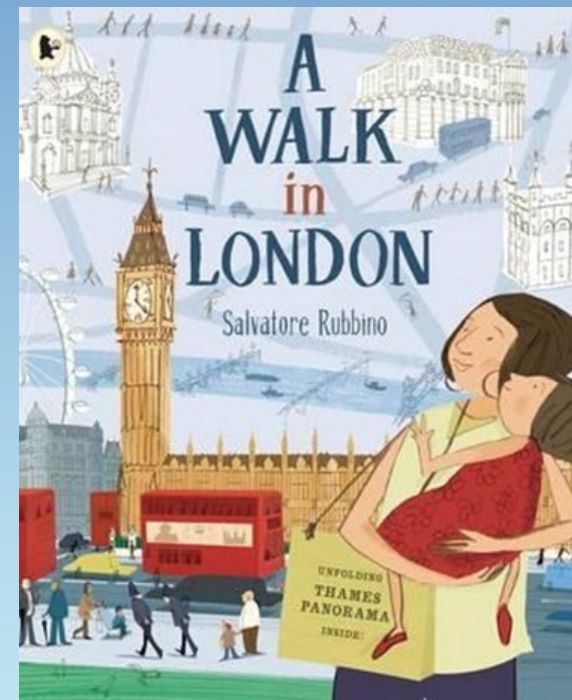

Reading

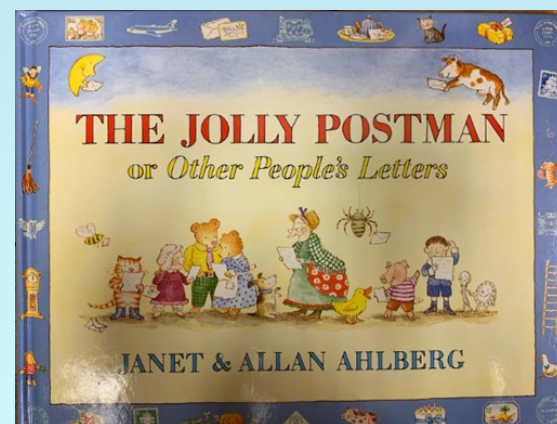
We will be reading lots of fiction and non-fiction texts both as a focus for our Literacy lessons and to also instil a love of reading. The children will read on a one to one basis each week and will have reading books sent home. It is important that the children read at home for 10-15 minutes every day.

Writing

We will be writing simple sentences using our phonic knowledge to spell words containing the sounds we have previously learnt in our phonics sessions. We will be writing letters and postcards.

Please support your child by reading with them on a daily basis. Whether reading a story to them or listening to your child read their school reading books. You can also support your child as they practice reading and writing tricky words.



Learning Outdoors

Learning in Maths

Points to Remember
