This week's learning

- Nursery made their own hedgehog biscuits! They talked about what hedgehogs are, what they look like and the noises they make.
- Reception have been learning all about 'matching' in maths. They matched packed lunches and found matching leaves in the garden.
- Year 1 have been learning all about deciduous trees. The children went on an exciting leaf hunt around our school grounds, carefully collecting different leaves they found. Using an identification sheet, they worked hard to match each leaf to the correct tree and enjoyed spotting the similarities and differences between them.
- Year 2 went to Debdale park to conduct a field study to look for human and physical features.
- Year 3 have been learning about how bread is made. They tasted different types of bread such as Focaccia, Roti, Naan, Brioche.
- Year 4 have made a start on bubble printing for their pumpkins.
- Year 5 have been writing and performing poems.
- Year 6 have been learning how to alter their singing voices using different pitch, dynamics and tempo.

Please donate any unwanted (but good quality) clothes, shoes, bags, accessories, bedding and towels.

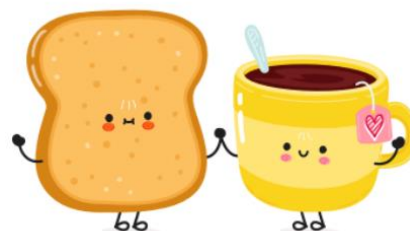
Remember the more the bags weigh, the more they will pay us and the money goes straight towards our school food bank and uniform bank!
