

## Year 1

### Intent:

At Abbey Hey, we value the importance of a smooth and high-quality transition from Early Years into Key Stage 1. Teachers in Reception and Year 1 work closely together to ensure that children feel safe and happy as they move from Development Matters to The National Curriculum.

We aim to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum that is exciting and motivates all children. We use real life experiences to bring new concepts to life. We inspire children to become inquisitive and look at the world with awe and wonder.

### Implementation

- As part of the high-quality daily phonics lessons we teach, children are taught to decode words to prepare them for the phonics screening check.
- Children are introduced to new sounds, practise reading common exception words and read books closely matched to their phonics ability
- English is taught daily and always based on a high-quality text linked, to our class topic.
- Adults read stories to the children every day and a love of reading is promoted through a daily 30 minute 'reading for pleasure' time.
- Children take part in a daily maths lessons. Every lesson includes time to explore and discuss mathematical concepts. Concrete resources are available at all times to support children's understanding. Following 'Maths no Problem' the children complete work in groups and independently. They reason and problem solve in a variety of different ways.
- Our carefully selected topics follow the interests of the children. We begin each topic with an exciting hook to inspire and motivate the children.

- Children will be fully equipped with the decoding skills necessary to meet the expected standard for the phonics screening check.
- Children's attainment in core and foundation subjects is in line with or exceeding their potential when we consider the varied starting points of children.
